## The online Master's in Reading Education

The KU School of Education and Human Sciences offers both a reading specialist licensure track and a non-licensure track for the <u>online Master of Science in Education (M.S.E.)</u> in curriculum and instruction with an emphasis in reading education. Based on the science of reading, a body of research and theories explaining effective literacy instruction, these programs help teach literacy at all age levels. Explore the intersection of diversity and literacy in the KU online master's in reading education program and learn to support populations with different reading challenges, including dyslexia.

- Application fee: \$65 for U.S. residents, \$85 for international applicants
- IELTS or TOEFL scores (for non-native English-speaking applicants)

## What You'll Learn

In the online master's in reading education, you will build a robust, science-based understanding of the foundations of literacy. You'll explore ways to address linguistic and cultural diversity in literacy teaching. You'll also learn how to connect with striving readers through assessment and effective instruction from pre-kindergarten through adults, including adults with reading disabilities. By the program's end, you will achieve mastery of each of its four key outcomes: Teaching All Students, Knowing and Using Research, Pedagogical Content Knowledge, and Foundational Knowledge.

## Career Outcomes

The online master's in reading education can prepare educators for reading specialist roles at the elementary, middle, or high school level. This program can also lead to potential career paths that include PK-12 literacy coach, adult literacy teacher, consultant for a publisher of reading textbooks, or a reading education-focused role in higher education.
