The University of Kansas School of Education and Human Sciences offers both a teacher track and a non-teacher track in its <u>online master's in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL)</u> program. The teacher track of the program satisfies the requirements for the state-approved endorsement in the state of Kansas for teachers with existing licensure. Neither the teacher track nor non-teacher track lead to initial licensure.

These programs train individuals to help students navigate language and culture in various educational settings; including English as a Second Language (ESL) and English as an Additional Language (EAL) in U.S. schools, and multicultural learners across the world in English as foreign language (EFL) or English as a lingua franca (ELF) settings.

Whether you want to add an endorsement to your initial license, want a career shift, or just want to better support students in your school or district, our online master's in TESOL will prepare you to help students from many culturally diverse backgrounds succeed in early childhood, PK–12, or adult education classrooms.
