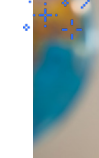

Introduction to Austim

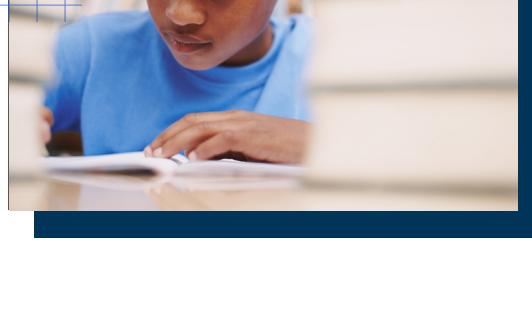
Special Education: The Introduction to Autism course is designed to give you a grounding in the basic issues and current trends related to autism identification and intervention.

National Leaders in special education

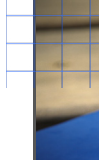

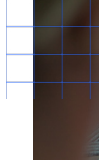

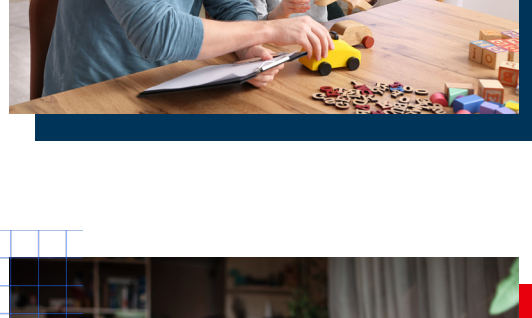
Key Milestones in Special Education

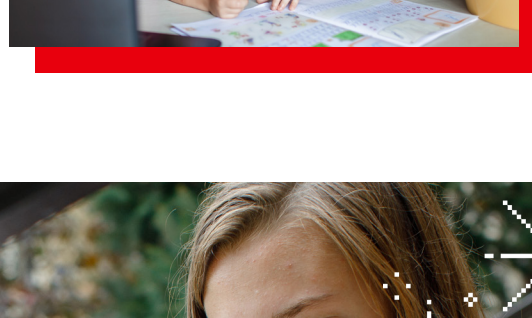

SPED 854

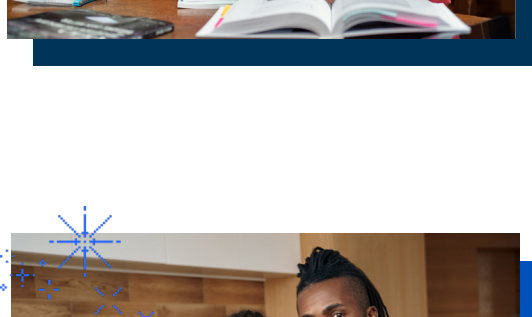
Family and Interprofessional Collaboration in Special Education

Special Education: This course provides skills for implementing special education mandates, building relationships with families, and developing effective school programs for students with disabilities.

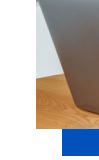


EPSY 715

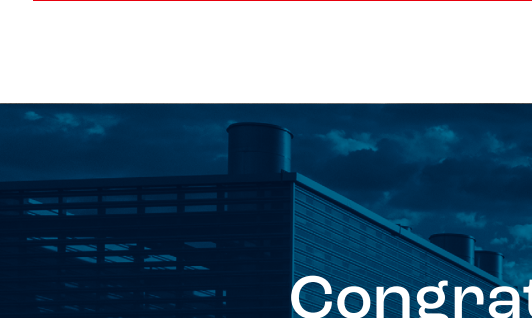
Please note: This course fulfills the requirement of a research methods course in the first 12 hours of graduate study.
