C&T 709

Foundations of Curriculum and Instruction

This course covers the basic concepts and processes of curriculum and instruction, including theories, planning models, resources for decision-making, current trends, research, and proposals for improvement of curriculum and instruction.



C&T 803

Differentiating Curriculum and Instruction

This course is designed to support educators in expanding curriculum and instruction to accommodate diverse learners in the classroom, K-12. It covers designing lessons, evaluating progress, and collaborating with students, parents, and colleagues.



EPSY 715

Understanding Research in Education

This course introduces key concepts and skills for analyzing educational research, covering basic research methodologies such as quantitative and qualitative methods and historical and descriptive research.

Please note: This course fulfills the requirement of a research methods course in the first 12 hours of graduate study.

C&T 806

Instructional Strategies and Models

This course is an analysis of the models of teaching which represent distinct orientations toward students and how they learn. The application of these models is complemented by the study of research evidence on effective teaching strategies.



C&T 770

Pedagogical Considerations in the 21st Century Classrooms

This course examines contemporary teaching methods and strategies in the 21st-century classroom, focusing on enhancing student learning and engagement through current learning environments.



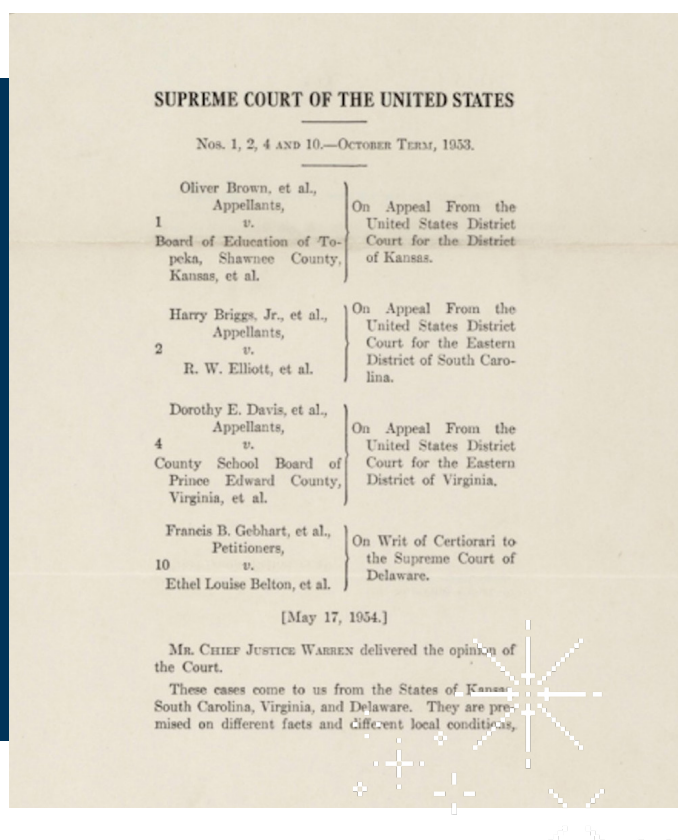
C&T 802

Curriculum Planning for Educational Settings

This course focuses on organizing and managing curriculum development in educational settings. It emphasizes decisions such as writing philosophies, setting goals, selecting and organizing content, and designing evaluation procedures. The course also covers providing leadership in the collaborative process of curriculum planning.

Key milestone in curriculum and instruction

The *Brown v. Board of Education* (1954) decision declared racial segregation in schools unconstitutional, profoundly reshaping curriculum and instruction. This landmark case ensured that students from all racial backgrounds had equal access to educational resources in classrooms nationwide.²



C&T 874

Constructivist Learning Technology

This course explores (1) important constructivist learning theories, (2) how such learning theories can be used in designing and developing computer-based learning environments, and (3) how student learning can be assessed in those environments.



KU SOEHS: An Evolving Legacy

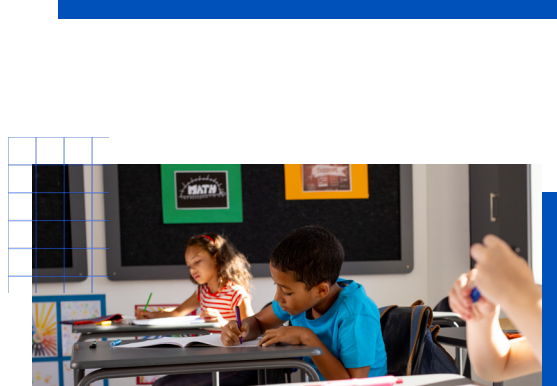

Planning for School Improvement

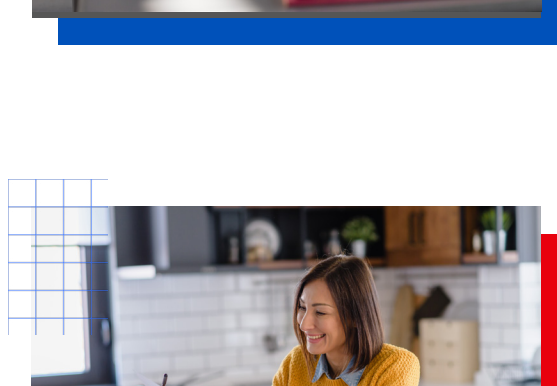
This course focuses on research and practices for school reform and student success, particularly in professional development and data analysis related to school improvement plans.



C&T 807

Multicultural Education

This course explores the impact of issues such as ethnicity, the melting pot theory, separatism, cultural pluralism, legal matters, and bilingual education on curriculum and instruction in contemporary classrooms.



C&T 890

Bridging Theory to Practice: Capstone Portfolio

This capstone course allows students to reflect on their learning by creating a digital portfolio that showcases their knowledge, skills, and engagement with relevant literature and demonstrates how they can apply what they've learned in current or future contexts.
